This film is being presented in collaboration with the *Japanese American Citizens League of Houston*; *Asian Pacific American Heritage Association (APAHA)*; and *Consulate General of Japan at Houston*.

During WWII, soldiers of the 442nd Infantry Regiment, composed mainly of Japanese-Americans, fought not only the enemy, but also prejudice, as they faced severe racial discrimination in their homeland. Despite these challenges, the 442nd became one of the most decorated regiments for its size and length of service in the history of the United States military.

Floyd Mori, president of the National Japanese American Citizens League will be attending the screening as a Q & A with Floyd will follow the screening.

Tickets will be available one month before the film is aired. General admission is \$7, matinee admission is \$6, and children 5 and under are admitted free. *MFAH members, senior adults, and students with ID receive a \$1 discount*. Discount passes, good for 10 admissions each, are \$60 (\$55 for *MFAH members, senior adults, and students with ID*). The MFAH Films box office accepts payment by cash, check, and credit card.
