

My dear Miss Kishi:

I am glad to advise you that your application for admission has been approved with provisional advanced standing in the following Rice equivalents: English 100 and 200; Mathematics 100; History 250; French 200; Chemistry 100; government, one course; Economics 200; and Biology 100. We shall admit you next year to an extra course schedule, involving five courses, three of which must be advanced, and also including one course in science. This will be subject to the usual extra course grade requirement, which I feel reasonably sure you will have no difficulty in meeting. Then, a regular Senior schedule should graduate you at the end of the following year.

Please note carefully the date set for your registration, indicated on the attached memorandum, and plan to be here at that time. If, due to any circumstances now unforeseen, you find it impossible to enter Rice this fall, please notify us as soon as you can, preferably before August 15th. We hope nothing will prevent your entering, but if you cannot come, another applicant will want your place.

The new catalogue will not be off the press until late in the summer. It will contain only a few changes in the courses outlined in the copy for 1935-36. If you have not yet received the copy for the year just mentioned, please let us hear from you and one will be sent you immediately.
