Under the authority of the Trading with the enemy Act, as amended, and Executive Order No. 9095, as amended, and pursuant to law, the undersigned, after investigation, finding:

(a) That the property described as follows: 988 shares of no par value capital stock of Orange Petroleum Corporation, a Delaware corporation, the numbers of the certificates representing which, the number of shares represented by such certificates, and the names and last known addresses of the registered owners of which, are, respectively, as follows:

(b) That the property described as follows: All right, title, interest and claim of any name or nature whatsoever of the aforesaid Kawasaki Dockyard Company, Ltd. and/or its successor Kawasaki Heavy Industries, Ltd. in and to all indebtedness, contingent or otherwise and whether or not matured, owing to them or either of them by said Orange Petroleum Corporation, including but not limited to all security rights in and to any and all collateral for any or all of such indebtedness and the right to sue for and collect such indebtedness, is an interest in the aforesaid business enterprise held by a national of an enemy country, and also is property within the United States owned or controlled by a national of a (Orange Petroleum Corporation) designated enemy country (Japan), and determining that the property described in this sub-paragraph (b) is necessary for the maintenance or safeguarding of other property namely, that hereinbefore described in sub-paragraph (a) belonging to the same national of the same designated enemy country and subject to vesting (and in fact vested by this order) pursuant to Section 2 of said Executive Order; and determining that to the extent that any or all of such nationals are persons not within a designated enemy country the national interest of the United States requires that such persons be treated as nationals of a designated enemy country, and having made all determinations and taken all action, after appropriate consultation and certification, required by said Executive Order or Act or otherwise, and deeming it necessary in the national interest, hereby vests all such property, to be held, used, administered, liquidated, sold or otherwise dealt with in the interest of and for the benefit of the United States.

Such property and any or all of the proceeds thereof shall be held in a special account pending further determination of the Alien Property Custodian. This shall not be deemed to limit the powers of the Alien Property Custodian to return such property or the proceeds thereof, or to indicate that compensation will not be paid in lieu thereof, if and

Returned?

Any person, except a national of a designated enemy country, asserting any claim arising as a result of this order may file with the Alien Property Custodian a notice of his claim, together with a request for a hearing thereon, on Form APC-1, within one year from the date hereof, or within such further time as may be allowed by the Alien Property Custodian. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to constitute an admission of the existence, validity or right to allowance of any such claim.

The terms "National", "designated enemy country" and "business enterprise within the United States" as used herein shall have the meanings prescribed in Section 10 of said Executive Order.
